
Please continue to support us through membership in the Montebello Historical Society, docent service at the Adobe museum, or donations to the Adobe Museum Fund.

Mexican War Cannonball Found in Montebello Backyard

About two months ago David Castle was trying out his new metal detector in his parents' backyard near Date Street and Montebello Boulevard when a big reading hit. He dug down about a foot and found an old cannonball. He wondered why a cannonball would be in his parents' yard, so he started to investigate the local history. He found out that there was a large battle fought on the banks of the Rio San Gabriel in 1847. Could this cannonball be from that battle?



He contacted the Montebello Historical Society and came to the museum to meet the curator.

There are two

stories about the cannons used by the Californios at the Battle of Rio San Gabriel. One is that they were brought up from Mexico around 1817. The four guns landed in San Pedro. The Spanish government was going to build a presidio or fort, but never did. So the guns sat on the beach until 1846 when the local Californios gathered them for defense against the up and coming American invasion.

The other story is that they are from the Russian American Company trading ship, the Mercury, from Boston, which was captured by the Spanish ship Flora in 1813. The Spanish then left six or eight cannons from the Mercury at San Pedro to defend the Spanish crown in case of revolutionists from Mexico. Since most Spanish cannons had a Spanish crest or markings on them, the curator now believes that the four guns with no markings used at the Battle of Rio San Gabriel are of American origin.

Is the cannonball American and used against them at the Battle of Rio San Gabriel? Is it deformed from sitting out in the elements from 1813-1846? Have there been other cannonballs or artifacts found since the battle? If you know of any items, please contact the Montebello Historical Society.

There are three museums in California that feature Mexican War battles that took place near their locations - San Pasqual, Dominquez and Montebello, but none of them have actual artifacts from the battles. We might be the first museum with an actual artifact. The cannonball is now on loan to the museum and there is still a lot of research ahead to find out its origin. Is it Spanish or American?
